

#### **CHRIST IN THE CITY**

A group of Dallas seminarians have been living at the Catholic Conference and Formation Center in Oak Cliff this summer, where they have followed a disciplined schedule of communal prayer, fraternity and work at various sites. Additionally, they have spent time ministering to the Dallas homeless. Christ in the City, a Catholic organization based in Denver, sent representatives to Dallas to train the seminarians on how to approach and reach

out to this vulnerable population, who is so often overlooked in our community. Twice a week, the seminarians have been walking the same routes as their homeless brothers and sisters to encounter, know and love them while offering them supplies such as food, water and socks.

**Nick Weiss** writes: "Working with the homeless has been a huge blessing this summer. I was a bit hesitant to begin this ministry, but it has been a wonderful opportunity to encounter Christ in the poor and to be His presence at the same time. We have developed some genuine relationships with our friends on the street, which I would never have imagined before this summer."
